The Water Wars – they're something that you've heard about here in Georgia for more than two decades. Sometimes they're making headline news. Other times, they're more in the background, as Governors, attorneys and other federal, state and local officials work on negotiations and analyze complicated research.

Today, the water dispute between Georgia and Florida lies in the ability of the two states to reach an agreement on water use from the Chattahoochee and Flint rivers or leave their fate to a decision made by a special master appointed by the U.S. Supreme Court.

It's about the use of a limited natural resource unarguably tied to the state's future growth and economic development. As a county official it is important to understand and appreciate how water is used to drive the state's economy – both in the densely populated metro Atlanta region as well as in the agricultural belt across south Georgia.
