Pack your bags for the ACCG Fall Mobile Classroom - an experiential road trip adventure! The ACCG Mobile Classroom is a two-day, limited opportunity excursion that takes an in-depth look at an important issue in Georgia through behind-the-scenes site visits and information from county and state experts.

*This year's Mobile Classroom will focus on advancements in public safety technology making a difference in Georgia communities and provide insight into the training that law enforcement officers, firefighters, 911 operators and others take to learn critical skills and reduce liability risk.

How Mobile Classroom Works

Participants will meet at the Houston County Government Center (201 Perry Parkway, Perry, Georgia 31069) by 8:15 a.m. on Monday, Sept. 21. Participants will leave their vehicles at the Houston County Government Center and board the charter bus for the remainder of the mobile classroom. Participants will return to their vehicles on Tuesday, Sept. 22 by 4 p.m. Networking on the charter bus is an important part of the mobile classroom experience; **therefore, no county participants will be allowed to drive their own vehicles.**

THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS POLICY.

Registration

Due to limited space on the charter bus, the ACCG Mobile Classroom is limited to 32 people on a first come, first serve basis. County clerks and/or registrars for ACCG events will need to log into Engagifii to register county officials for the ACCG Mobile Classroom. **Registration will open in Engagifii on Thursday, July 9 at 9 a.m.**

Due to limited seating, no more than two county elected officials or staff may be registered before August 14. If more than two people are interested, county clerks and/or registrars should email that person's name to ddouglas@accg.org to add them to the waiting list. If the event is not full by Aug. 14, 2026, county clerks and/or registrars will be contacted regarding individuals on the waiting list.

Cost

Registration is \$400. This registration fee includes:

- All meals (beginning with lunch on Sept. 21)
- Hotel accommodations on Monday, Sept. 21 only
- Motorcoach transportation.

Optional Hotel Reservations for Sunday, September 20

Participants who require hotel accommodations on Sunday evening in order to arrive at the Houston County Government Center by 8:15 a.m. on Monday morning **should make their own reservation at the Fairfield by Marriott Inn & Suites** (100 General Courtney Hodges Boulevard, Perry, Georgia 31069) by calling 478-732-1149.

Important Note: ACCG will **NOT** be making or responsible for canceling hotel reservations for participants on Sunday evening.

Important Information:

- **Security Clearance Information Required** - At least one of the facilities that will be visited requires security clearance. Therefore, as part of the registration process, county clerks and/or registrars will be required to enter the participant's legal name as it appears on their government ID. Participants must have their government ID on their person to enter these facilities.
- **Close-Toed Shoes Required** – At least one of the facilities that the ACCG Mobile Classroom will visit requires visitors to wear close-toed shoes. ACCG encourages you to wear comfortable footwear throughout the trip, as there will be a good bit of walking!

Refund Policy

The cancellation deadline is **Aug. 21, 2026**. Cancellations received in writing by this date will be entitled to a full refund, minus a \$50 administrative fee. Cancellations received in writing **Aug. 24 - Sept. 14, 2026** will be entitled to a 50% refund of fees paid. There will be no refunds offered for cancellations received after **Sept. 14, 2026**, unless the participant is able to substantiate a sound reason for the late notification, such as an emergency beyond the participant's control, in which case ACCG must be notified of the emergency within seven (7) days of the ACCG Mobile Classroom.

9:15 a.m. Crisp County 911 Center
One of ACCG's top legislative priorities in recent years has been funding to support the implementation of NextGen 911. Priorities include funding for the deployment of the statewide emergency IP-based network, as well as the required connections and equipment at county 911 centers. Crisp County Sheriff Billy Hancock, who also serves as Chairman of the Georgia Emergency Communications Authority (GECA) – the state agency responsible for the implementation of NextGen 911, will provide a tour of the county's 911 center and explain how the implementation of NextGen 911 compares to the county's current operations. He will be joined by Aleisha Rucker-Wright, GECA Deputy Executive Director, who will provide an update on the state's implementation plan and what counties should be considering now.

Macon-Bibb County Sheriff's Office Criminal Investigation Division Captain Jean Lebeuf will provide an interactive experience to show how Flock cameras are used in real time to solve crimes by detecting license plates and vehicle characteristics, tracking stolen vehicles and identifying suspects in violent crimes, and locating missing persons. Participants will tour the Real Time Crime Center and see a larger 911 center in action.

Have you ever wondered how public safety personnel are trained for the situations they encounter? Here's your chance to see if you have what it takes! The Georgia Public Safety Training Center is the Georgia's premiere training facility for all state and local public safety personnel including law enforcement, firefighters, communications officers, coroners, emergency management officers, rescue officers, jail officers and other emergency service personnel. Step into simulators where you take control as the incident commander, operate a fire truck, respond to a 911 call and face shoot – don't shoot situations. See how drones are used in firefighting and hazardous materials responses. This tour will provide unique, hands-on opportunities that will provide insight into the newest technology tools available to public safety personnel and the training provided for first responders.
