911 Fee Types

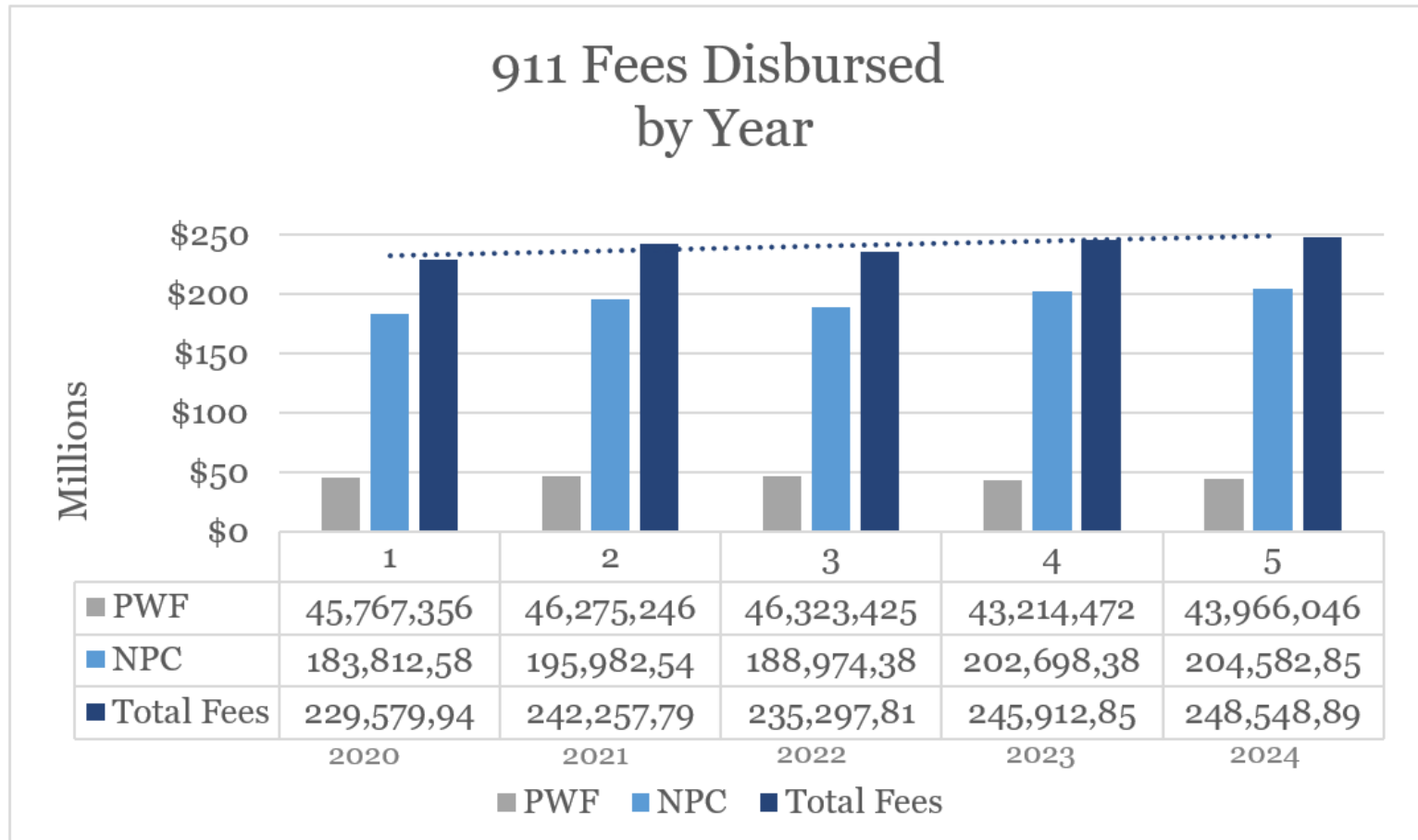
Prepaid Wireless Fee (PWF)

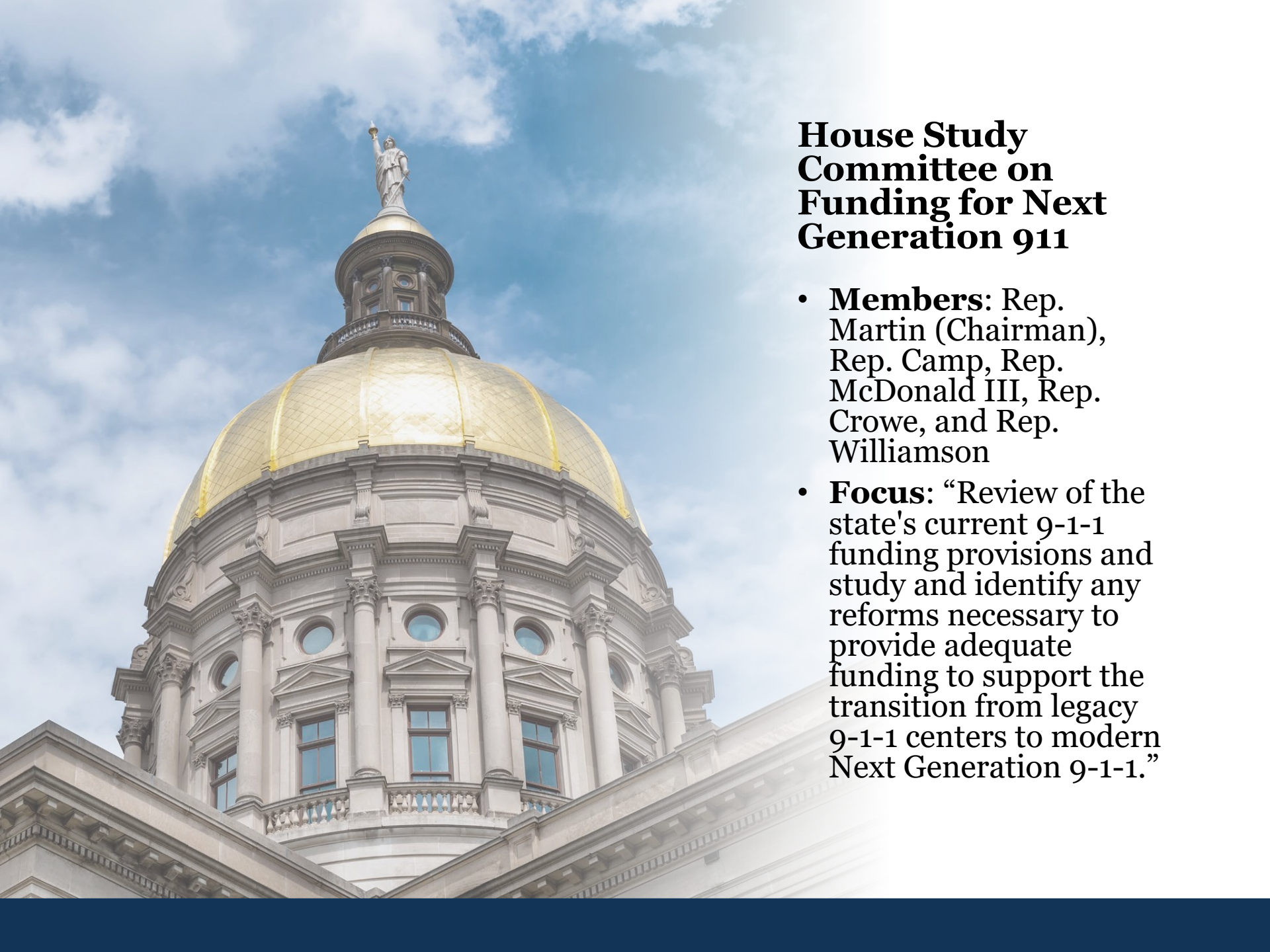
- The prepaid wireless fee is collected at the retail sale for prepaid wireless telephone service.
- Increased from 75 cents to \$1.50 per transaction in 2018.
- Locals receive 95% of these fees, which are distributed according to the population of each qualifying county and city.

Non-Prepaid Charge (NPC)

- The non-prepaid charge is a \$1.50 monthly fee on non-prepaid wireline, wireless, and voice over internet protocol (VoIP) telephone services.
- Locals receive 97% of these fees, which are distributed based on the service subscribers' enhanced ZIP code.

Fee Collection Trend





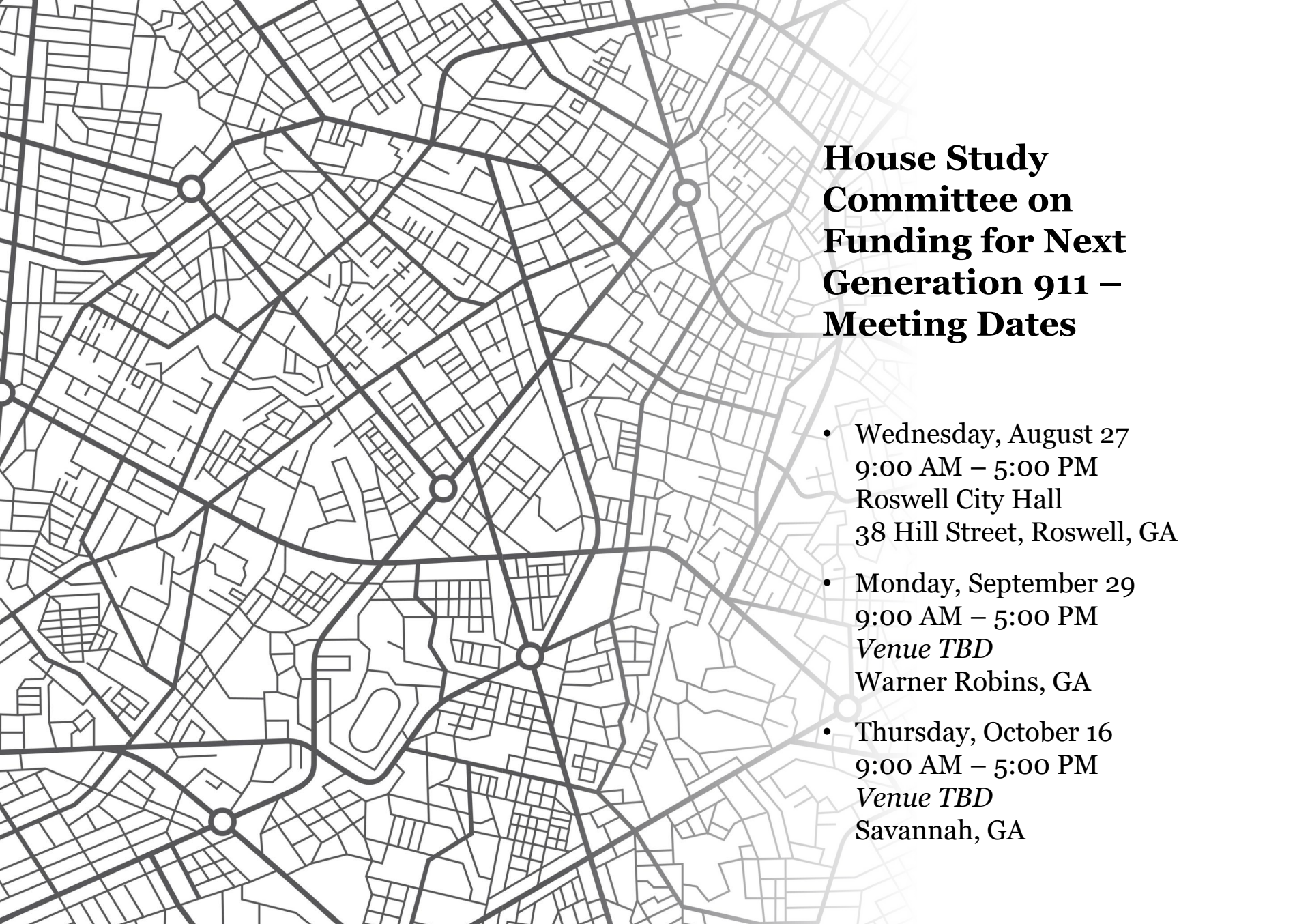
House Study Committee on Funding for Next Generation 911
